Following the implementation of the Read, Write Inc programme in September 2022 monitoring has highlighted how in just a short time, nearly all pupils have made significant progress with their literacy skills, particularly with their phonics and reading. As a result of high quality professional learning provided last year, the school is developing a comprehensive and consistent approach to the teaching of phonics that ensures pupils make effective progress in their literacy skills. However, the school needs to build on the work already undertaken; further embed the systems and processes of Read, Write Inc and continue to invest in high quality professional learning to support all teachers to continually strengthen their teaching of literacy to ensure pupil progress is maximized and that pupils develop the key literacy skills needed to become ambitious, capable learners.
