

# Regional School Liaison Officers project

# Regional School Liaison Officers project

## CASE MANAGEMENT IMPACT

### Case management overview

Available to schools that have an individual Service child with a specific need related to the impact of their Armed Forces lifestyle. The impact of mobility and/or separation can have an academic, social and emotional impact on Service children. Challenges may arise that require support outside of the capacity of the school and/or local authority (LA). In these instances, the RSLO will work with the school and LA to identify appropriate support and interventions.

### Case management activities

The RSLOs have worked with a number of schools across Wales to provide support and advice regarding the specific needs of individual Service children. Two instances have resulted in funded projects to support an individual Service child.

### Case management example

**Service child:** Has experienced high mobility, is an EAL pupil and joined the school during lockdown. The pupil was extremely shy, was uncomfortable with communicating with his peers and teachers, and was disengaged from most lessons in school.

**Awarded:** £500

**Intervention:** Release a member of staff, who the pupil had built a positive rapport with, to deliver interventions that aimed to improve the pupils confidence, communication and wellbeing in school.

**Impact:** After several weeks of support, the pupil was noticeably more engaged with learning and peers, and grew the confidence to partake in a PE lesson for the first time since joining the school.








## Remembrance learning materials

We are delighted to announce that we have launched our 2021 Teaching Remembrance educational resources.

As this year marks 100 years of the RBL and Remembrance, the resources help children to explore who, how and why we remember through different formats, activities and stimuli. Through looking at examples from Britain and the Commonwealth, our resources explore how Remembrance has evolved, and is still evolving, and discusses what Remembrance may look like in future.

Created in partnership with the National Literacy Trust, the resources range from assemblies and book clubs to whole school projects. The offer caters to children in Key Stage 1-5 (4-19 years), the first time we've extended our offer to Key Stage 5. All these resources are designed to be used flexibly at school and at home. ## Education grants

Available through the Royal British Legion (RBL), there are two education grant schemes currently available within the Women's Section.

### **The Children's Welfare Scheme**

Offers grants up to a maximum of £500 per household and is for children who need essential items – aimed to support families and single parents who are suffering financial hardship or in times of need.

### **The President's Award Scheme**

Offers two separate educational bursaries for eligible beneficiaries:

1. The Educational Grant – is aimed at assisting with one off costs linked to Education for current and former service personnel, their spouse/partners and dependants (children under 18 or in full time education, or medically dependant). Examples of areas that fall within this grant type, visit the RBL website that lists previous items that the Committee have previously awarded.
2. Accommodation Scholarship Grants – is aimed to assist with someone's first degree only and is to be used towards accommodation costs whilst away at University. Those that can apply are dependents of current and former service personnel aged 21 years or under (for initial applications).

## CEAS

Children's Education Advisory Service (CEAS) is part of Defence Children Services (DCS) at the Ministry of Defence (MOD). We are a tri-service organisation which provides support to Service and eligible MOD civilian families on a wide range of educational issues, including:

- Parental rights and responsibilities
- Children/young person's rights and responsibilities
- Additional Learning Needs (ALN)
- School admissions and appeals
- Overseas education in non-MOD school areas and supportability
- Retention of Service Families Accommodation for educational purposes
- Continuity of Education Allowance (CEA) and the Special Educational Needs Addition (SENA).

The support offered by CEAS is bespoke, with all advice being child-centred and focussed on the best interests of the individual.

## SQUAD

Little Troopers, the military children's charity, has launched a brand-new podcast for military teenagers called SQUAD.

Presented by TV & radio broadcaster and mental health ambassador, Katie Thistleton and Leicester Tigers rugby star, Thom Smith – who's Dad still serves in the Royal Air Force – the eight-episode weekly podcast is the first of its kind to hand over the microphone to military teens who share their stories about Armed Forces life.

Listeners will hear from 15 military teenagers across the series as they chat about their personal experiences of being a service child and their views on some of the unique challenges that service children face including deployment and separation, schooling, moving home, having a serving parent and forming friendships.

Each episode is just twenty minutes long, giving schools the chance to listen to the podcast and use it to spark further conversation and classroom discussion.

## Forces Life Club

Bringing service pupils together regularly is a great way to offer pastoral support in school by providing a safe space for children to share their experiences and talk about any issues they face.

To help schools do this, Little Troopers has a free 'Forces Life Club' pack available on its website. The pack includes everything schools need to set-up and deliver a dedicated virtual or in-person pastoral support club for military children aged 11-18.

The club can be run however each individual school sees fit, whether that's a weekly session, after-school club or termly event and schools are encouraged to give children ownership of the Club so they can practice their own emerging leadership skills. Children can pick and choose different sessions to deal with the current challenges they face such as deployments, separation or frequent moves. 



## Tir Coed Woodland Art



The project was part-funded by the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust and the Welsh Government with SSCE Cymru.


We all enjoyed it so much and we hope to work with Tir Coed more in the future.


