

As you are aware, this academic year sees the full roll-out of the new curriculum across Wales which requires a new approach to how we assess children's progress in learning and how we track and record this. We will share more information regarding this throughout the term.

<u>Breakfast Club –</u> In response to the school community feedback during the consultation undertaken by the school and Governing Body regarding the Asymmetric week, from Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May Breakfast Club will open at 8am. Entry will continue to be through the hall door and children need to have registered prior to their first session.

<u>Late arrivals and early departures</u> Please be aware that school starts promptly at 9am with the doors open from 8:45am. We continue to need to respond to the school door bell to let a regular stream of children in after 9am. As a small staff this does disturb the start of the morning as we respond to the bell. We would be extremely grateful for everyone's support in enabling the start of the day to run smoothly for all classes. Likewise, whilst we will always endeavour to ensure your child is ready by a lobby if there is a significant reason for them leaving earlier than 3:30pm, this again

takes staff from learning tasks which do run up to the end of the school day. Thank you to everyone's help with this.

<u>Values Education</u> — We have started learning about and reflecting on our whole school value for the half term which is 'Justice'. We learnt about the actions of the King of Denmark during World War 2 and reflected on a number of other individuals and stories we have heard where the children have recognised the justice taking place, or not happening. Ask your child the question asked by the King of Denmark, 'Where do you hide a star?' to learn more!



<u>Headlice</u> Unfortunately there are cases of headlice in the school again. In order to deal with this pest can all families please ensure that they check their child's / children's hair thoroughly and treat if required. Thank you for your support with this.

<u>Hedgehogs –</u> Dosbarth Dale ended the week with a fantastic surprise as Pembrokeshire Hogspital paid a visit to class again. Following on from our visit from hedgehogs earlier in the school year, Ginny was back to visit us again with two hedgehogs who had been in the hogspital, but were found in Spittal! They are now back to full health and size and were ready to be released back into their natural habitat. Dosbarth Dale were ready with two hedgehog houses and two feeding stations as homes for the hedgehogs! Everyone was very excited to see the hedgehogs enjoying their new space and homes in our school grounds.
