#### School Uniform

At Coed Hirwaun we are very proud of our pupils and the majority of our children always wear their uniform. #### Below is a reminder of our summer uniform at school:

In summer, smart navy shorts/skorts can be worn. Yellow and white gingham dresses can be worn with a navy or white cardigan.

<u>Please note:</u> Short length cycling shorts/gym shorts are not part of our school uniform and should not be worn to school. <u>Regular length cycling shorts can be worn for PE sessions only.</u>

Open toe sandals or Croc style shoes should not be worn for the safety of the children.

## **Parking and School Safety**

At the start of a new term, can I please remind you that children attending Breakfast Club, need to be accompanied to the main door and signed in by a member of Breakfast Club staff. If your child walks to or from school unaccompanied, please ensure you have completed a consent form for them to do so.

Please remember that safety is paramount when parking around school. We understand that this can be difficult at busy times but do not park on the yellow lines, even for a short time. We continue to work closely with the police and NPT Road Safety Team.

The main school gate is locked throughout the school day. Please do not use the car park for Breakfast Club drop-off or Afterschool Club collection. If access is needed, please call the school office to arrange.

We have seen an increasing number of parents stopping at the school fence during playtimes and lunch times, calling pupils over to talk and hand over belongings. Please do not do this as we are regularly telling our children that they should not do this. Staff have also been informed not to allow this to happen. If there is a message for the child, please contact the office.
