Mrs White's News ~ Over the past few weeks Year 1 have been





They have also been looking at recycling in their topic work, so we decided to build lighthouses out of recycled materials, which the children brought in from home. The children then used paper mâché to strengthen the lighthouses and then they were decorated and painted and will be displayed in the classroom with other work related to the story. Great teamwork carried out by all members of the class.

Year 6 News ~ In maths this week, we have been focussing on handling data. We have looked at different kind of conversion graphs including weight and money. We have also interpreted bar and line graphs and

used our knowledge of mean, mode and median to answer questions. In English, we have been reminiscing about our time here in Baglan Primary School and we have written about our memories in preparation for our Leaver's Assembly. As part of our success topic, we have continued to learn about the Commonwealth Games. We have been thinking about what makes a successful athlete. We have looked at the importance of food and making sure we eat a nutritional diet. We studied the different food groups. We designed food pyramids which highlighted the foods that we should be eating. As part of our Right of the Month, Article 7 - The right to a name and nationality, we discussed the importance of being Welsh and representing our country. Next week, we will be finding out about Welsh athletes who are participating in the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham. We also discussed the importance of learning about different cultures and languages.



Year 1 News ~ This week in Year 1 we have been busy learning about different sea creatures. We have worked in collaborative groups to find out information and then used that information to create fact files on our favourite sea creatures.



We found out where they lived, what they ate and then researched a fun fact.

We have also been discussing under the sea food chains and have used Venn diagrams to talk about differences between two sea creatures. We have also been learning about the effect pollution has on these sea creatures and how we can all work together to help keep our seas and oceans clear of pollution. We came up with lots of good ideas such as re using plastic bags and bottles and making sure we recycle all

the plastic we use at home and school. We also talked about other ways of keeping our planet healthy by knocking off lights and other electrical items when we are not using them and turning the tap off when cleaning our teeth. The children have finished their lighthouses with Mrs White and they look fantastic!



Nursery News ~ This week we introduced our new book 'Clean Up!' It's all about cleaning up our seaside to protect sea creatures and our planet. The children have been working on their fine motor skills by collecting plastic from the sea with tweezers and collecting oil using a pipette and squeezing it back into a separate container, all while learning about the impact plastic and oil has on sea creatures and the planet!

The children have been planting flowers in our garden this week. We have had a lovely talk about bees and what they do to help us and the world around us, and how we can help by planting flowers. The children are very excited about how pretty the garden is now with lots more colour, as well as helping the bees! Our mini beast detectives found a snail while preparing to plant, they have since found a new and suitable habitat for him - an excellent learning experience. Da iawn pawb!
