

We have been finding out all about our new teachers and they have also been finding out all about us. We have talked about our summer holidays and our favourite parts, we have also shared our favourite food, colour, sport and many other things. It has been lovely getting to know each other.



We have made our class charter, discussing what rules we think we need and are important to keep in our class. We have also been settling into our class routine, we complete the weather chart in the mornings, along with chanting our times tables, singing songs of the days of the week and months of the year, in Welsh and English.

In maths we have been looking at the place value of numbers, counting on in various steps from a

given number. We have also been writing out words for numbers, this has been tricky learning to spell some of the words but Miss Randall is impressed with us all.

Nursery News ~ Welcome back to our returning children and a big welcome to our new starters in Nursery. It has been lovely to see all the children excited for school and it has certainly made my return from maternity an easy one. All the children have settled well into school life and have been enjoying exploring the nursery classroom and the different activities available to them. The children have been telling us what they have enjoyed doing in school this week. A firm favourite has been the play



dough table, where the children have been rolling, stretching and moulding the dough.



For literacy this week, we read the story 'Spot goes to School' and discussed all the activities we do in class that were the same as in the story. The children are very excited to learn the different letter sounds which will help them to read and write like Spot. For Maths, we have been exploring the 2d shapes; circle, square, triangle and rectangle. On the IWB we played a shape game to help us recognise and match the different 2d shapes. We also enjoyed singing the shape song. What a super start to the term Nursery. Da iawn!

<u>Year 5 & 6 News</u> ~ Welcome back to school Year 5 and 6! We have a fantastic week settling into our new class and routine. At the beginning of the week, we had a quiz to get to know our class teacher, and we played a game called 'two truths and a lie' so that she could get to know some facts about us too.

We did a lot of work on our rights at the beginning of the week. We were put into our new cooperative learning groups where we had to discuss and choose nine rights that we believed were important to school. We then put these in a diamond ranking to show which was the most and least important out of the nine we had chosen. As a class, we then used the most important rights to use in our class. We decided on these democratically and created a class charter together.



We wrote a recount of our favourite day during the summer holidays making sure we included correct punctuation and neat handwriting and we have had a spelling lesson looking at words that have the same spelling pattern.

In maths, we began looking at place value. We learnt the names for different numbers and were able to identify what each digit in a number stood for.

We have started learning our new Welsh vocabulary and sentence patterns. We will be using these to

write paragraphs all about ourselves in a couple of weeks.

We completed mind-maps on our new topic 'Healthy Me'. On the mind map we had to include what we already know about keeping ourselves healthy and what information we would like to learn throughout the topic.

We have started gymnastics for PE this week too. We are building up to creating a routine in partners or groups of three. We looked at different ways of travelling through the space, using the high, mid and low planes.
