Year 6 News ~ In English, we have been focussing on Explanation texts. We looked at videos of the Water Cycle and used this to write our own explanation text as part of a shared writing activity. We worked hard to include features such as hypothetical language, technical language, complex sentence and logical connectives. In maths, we have been learning to draw line graphs with two sets of data and learning how to collect data using tally marks. We have also been learning how to add and subtract fractions with

different denominators. In Welsh, we read the shape poem Cerdd Nadolig. The poem was in the shape of a Christmas Tree. We wrote our own shape poems about the things that

we would like for Christmas. We are really busy practicing for our Christmas concert. We can wait to share it with you all next week!





<u>Year 4 News</u> ~ Blwyddyn 4 have been learning about time recently in maths. We have been developing our understanding of the layout and features of newspaper reports as part of our language work. We have also been reading our guided reading class book, George's Marvellous Medicine. In PE, we

have attended football skills sessions with Premier League Primary Stars, we also enjoy the literacy and numeracy sessions

they offer. We have been playing xylophones to a season's song we have been learning during music sessions with Mrs James. Last week we also attended a samba drum lesson which was great fun... Amser bendigedig!



Year 1 News ~ This week in Year 1 we have been learning about states of matter. We learned that states of matter are solids, liquids and gasses. We talked about what makes a solid (the special particles are close together), what makes a liquid (further apart) and a gas (very far apart). We learned that solids cannot change shape, liquids fit inside their container and gasses don't have a shape. We have also been learning about capacity and have used the vocabulary full, half full and empty. Mr Atkins gave us 3 different sized containers and we had to estimate how many of the containers would fill a big bucket. We wrote down our estimates and then used the water tray to fill the containers and



then the bucket to see if our estimates were right. To finish our capacity work we filled some cups with delicious hot chocolate and drank until our cups were half empty and finally empty. We have been listening to the story 'The Gruffalo's Child' in the story the Gruffalo's Child has a snowman outside the Gruffalo cave. We discusses what we could to keep the snowman cold. We had lots of different ideas ranging from putting him into a fridge to building an idea ground him. We wrote all ideas
