

What is safeguarding?

Ensures that every child, regardless of their age, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex, or sexual orientation, has a right to equal protection from harm.

Safeguarding is the steps that people take to protect children and vulnerable adults from harm.

Safeguarding concerns to look out for:



Physical

A group of boys push a smaller boy over during football practice when the coach is not looking



Emotional

You see a crying child run towards their parent who responds in a harsh manner using inappropriate language



Sexual

A teenage girl walking home is catcalled and harassed by a group of boys who try to lift up her skirt



Neglect

You see a child wearing the same dirty clothes everyday and who steals food from other children



How can you help?

If you ever see anything happen to a child that makes you feel uncomfortable, please let your DSL know. You are not causing problems but it could save a child from unnecessary harm.

Any one of these things might not mean anything, but if your Designated Safeguarding Lead isn't told, then they can't help.
