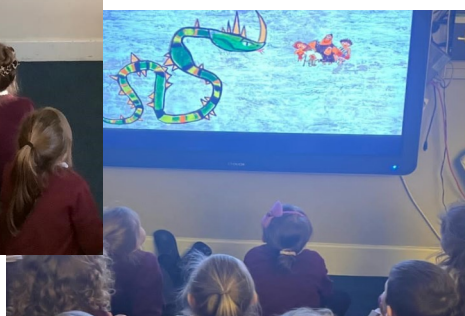
When Santa came to Gnoll Primary
