What's been going on this term?

In January, all pupils celebrated St Dwynwen's Day (25.01.23). To celebrate this important day, we all wore red to school and enjoyed taking part in lots of activities including singing, baking, poerty and story telling.

In February, pupils also celebrated 'Dydd Miwsig Cymru' on 10.02.23. The pupils in 'Criw Cymraeg' worked so hard with Mrs Daniel to organise this day and the whole school enjoyed wearing 'party clothes', performing and appraising welsh songs! They also created a video of our celebrations which has been placed on the school YouTube channel.

In March, we celebrated Dydd Gwyl Dewi! This is such an important time for us here in Wales that we had a whole school 'Welsh Week' and immersed the pupils in learning about our culture for the whole week. We thoroughly enjoyed art work, research, music, performances during the week, and especially seeing every class perfom so brilliantly in our Eisteddfod. The key message which we all



learned this week was 'Gwneud y pethau bychain' — 'do the little things' and as a staff, we can honestly say that we are so proud of our children who frequently go out of their way to 'do the little things'- a smile, a kind word and holding doors open for others are all 'little things' which we see regularly around our school.

The winners of our competitions, organised and judged by the 'Criw Cymraeg' were invited to attend Caffi Cymraeg with Mrs Daniel where they enjoyed some sweet treats as a reward for their effort! Da iawn pawb!

In March, we also celebrated 'World Book Day' where our theme was 'bedtime stories'. The pupils took part in lots of reading activities and thoroughly enjoyed swapping classes to read to one another as well as welcoming staff and visitors into their classes to read. A huge thank you to our lovely governors who came in to read their favourite bedtime stories!



On Safer Internet Day in February our 'Digital Leaders' set out to raise awareness of keeping safe



online. The whole school focused on raising awareness of the 'SMART' rules through class assemblies and activities set by digital leaders. KS2 also took part in an online live lesson with BBC Teach. The children designed a digital defence squad character and designed their own posters to display around the school about keeping safe online.

The pupils in the Rainbow Room have enjoyed a Music Session with staff from the Local Authority. The pupils used a variety of percussion instruments and interactive programmes to practise playing different songs and styles of music.

Many classes have enjoyed welcoming their families in to school to share what they have been learning and celebrate their work through our Class Assemblies including Nursery, Y2 SM, Y1 SC, Y3 JJ & DH and LSC ET and RK. The children have enjoyed sharing lots of themes including Mother's Day, Chinese New Year, Dydd Santes Dwynwen and Valentine's Day, the importance of music and our whole school concept of 'Exploration'.





This term, Reception parents have been invited in for a 5 week course to introduce the Read Write Inc programme, and to support them to develop their children phonological awareness and reading skills at home. This will continue higher up the school when this course is completed. Feedback has been really positive and attendance has increased week on week.

Our Y6 pupils have recently enjoyed a week long residential at Manor Adventure Outdoor Activity Centre in Brecon. They made us all so proud, representing the school so well off site and joining in lots of exciting activities including stand up paddling boarding, raft building, zip wiring, rifle shooting, aeroball and an evening disco! I would like to thank the staff that took the pupils and helped make sure they had an enjoyable and memorable week away.

So far this year we have held training sessions, carried out monitoring, visited others schools to view good practise, welcomed visits her to celebrate in our successes, developed family learning groups, worked with Education Support Officers from the Local Authority and worked with our Governors.
