Beginning in October, we will now have 'Missions' set up for different progression steps; Progression Step 1 - Nursery and Reception class

Progression step 2 - Years 1,2 &3 Progression step 3 - Years 4,5 & 6

We hope that this will tailor the activities more closely to your child's individual learning pace and they will cover all six of the areas of learning experience.

The missions will be intended for families to engage in learning with their children and aim to support families to create thriving learning environments at home. For more information or tips on creating a successful home learning environment, please pop and see Teresa who will be happy to give you hints and tips - it's really not as scary as it sounds!

Each month, individual classes will include a 'Routine for 15' element which will focus on key learning areas which they are focusing on. These will include aspects such as handwriting, reading, times tables, spelling and anything else which supports your child's academic successes. We hope that you find that 15 minutes each day of short activities will be manageable in busy households where time is precious, and also responds directly to the overwhelming requests of academic themed homework.
