




Saint	Description
 <p data-bbox="209 611 363 656">Dewi Sant</p>	<p data-bbox="611 248 1433 376">Patron saint of Wales. He taught people to live simply, care for others, and to “be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things.” Feast Day: 1 March.</p>
 <p data-bbox="209 1032 363 1077">St. Patrick</p>	<p data-bbox="611 663 1433 1014">He is the patron saint of Ireland. When he was young, he was taken far from home as a slave, but later escaped and bravely returned to Ireland to teach people about Jesus. St Patrick used a shamrock, with its three leaves, to explain the Holy Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We remember him for his courage, kindness, and love for God. His feast day is 17th March.</p>
 <p data-bbox="209 1458 491 1503">St. Francis of Assisi</p>	<p data-bbox="611 1084 1441 1211">Patron saint of animals and nature. He gave up wealth to live simply, loved all of God’s creation, and cared for the poor. Feast Day: 4 October.</p>
 <p data-bbox="209 1872 491 1910">St. Vincent De Paul</p>	<p data-bbox="611 1509 1433 1682">Known as the patron saint of charity. He dedicated his life to serving the poor, sick, and abandoned, and inspired others to do the same. Feast Day: 27 September.</p>



St. Valentine

Remembered as a saint of love and friendship. He showed courage in his faith and reminds us of the importance of kindness and care for others. Feast Day: 14 February.



St. Nicholas

Patron saint of children, sailors, and the poor. A generous bishop who secretly gave gifts to those in need – the inspiration for Father Christmas. Feast Day: 6 December.



St. Veronica

She showed compassion and courage by stepping forward to wipe Jesus' face as He carried His cross, offering kindness in a moment of suffering. She reminds us to show mercy and love, even in hard times. Feast Day: 12 July.
