

## Links with the Community

- Datblygu sgiliau entrepreneuriaid - siop ffrwythau amser chwarae.
- Datblygu sgiliau darllen/ysgrifennu - diolch i aelodau'r gymuned am gynorthwyo'r dysgwyr. Gwnaeth aelodau'r Cyngor Ysgol baratoi Cylchlythyr bob tymor. Trefnwyd Ffair Lyfrau yn ogystal.
- Datblygu sgiliau garddio - diolch i staff, rhieni ac aelodau'r gymuned am eu cymorth.

# Cysylltiadau gyda'r Gymuned

## *Links with the Community*

The school plays a very important role in the local community as well as the wider community. This includes the school community, the village of Llanddarog together with the rest of Wales and abroad. The learners are very enthusiastic in raising money for various charities such as Red Nose Day, Children in Need, the local food bank etc.

National initiatives are being promoted such as Eco schools, Healthy Schools and a number of various external agencies have held workshops at the school.

The learners contribute to discussions with the Police, with the Vicar of the Church and other visitors.

The year's events include:

- Opportunities to perform and entertain the community - a Christmas concert, singing and performing for the elderly in Porthyrhyd Hall, performing in the Urdd Eisteddfod (and winning) and performing a song composed by the Welsh Whisperer in the Village Hall in his company him
- Opportunities to be proud of their Welshness - Shwmae Sumae Day, Welsh Music Day, Santes Dwynwen, Quis Dim Clem, Book quiz, the school's Eisteddfod, the Urdd's Eisteddfod, the Let's Travel and Learn Patagonian Spanish project, speaking on Radio Cymru and competing in a Show Llanddarog.
- Developing inquiry skills - Adam's visit in the Garden, discussing the practitioners' trip to Canada, opening the school's doors to the community to learn about the history of the village and conversations with various visitors.
- Developing entrepreneur skills - playtime fruit shop.
- Developing reading/writing skills - thanks to community members for helping the learners. School Council members prepared a Newsletter each term. A Book Fair was also organised.
- Developing gardening skills - thanks to staff, parents and community members for their help
- Raising money for the school community - grants, disco, trip to Bath, Christmas fair and summer fair. Thank you to the Parent Teacher Association for their work throughout the year.

# Addysg yn / Education at Ysgol Gynradd Llanddarog

Ysgol yr Eglwys yng Nghymru, cyfrwng Gymraeg ydy Ysgol Gynradd Llanddarog. Mae disgylion yn cael eu hymdrochi yn yr iaith Gymraeg wrth ddechrau eu yn y Meithrin. Y prif iaith ar gyfer cyflwyno gwybodaeth a gwensi ar draws yr ysgol ydy Cymraeg. Er hyn, dysgir Saesneg yng ngwersi o Flwyddyn 3 i fyny ac mae pwyslais ar ddwyieithrwydd yn sicrhau fod disgylion â chyrhaeddiad uchel yn y ddwy iaith erbyn diwedd Blwyddyn 6. Mae'r Pennaeth a Staff yn cwrdd gyda darpar rieni cyn i'w plant ddechrau gan esbonio manteision dwyieithrwydd. Atgyfnerthir hyn gan yr holl staff yn ystod cyfarfodydd gyda rhieni, a.y.b.

Cefnogir a chynorthwyir rhieni i gefnogi eu plant gyda'u tasgau gwaith cartref. Rhoddir gwaith cartref ymhob dosbarth. Rhennir gwaith cartref yn seiliedig ar themâu tymhorol ar draws y flwyddyn. Atgyfnerthu sgiliau ag addysgwyd yn ysgol ydy pwrpas y gwaith cartref.

Mae'r rhan fwyaf o ddisgylion yn Ysgol Gynradd Llanddarog yn mynychu Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Maes y Gwendraeth ar gyfer eu haddysg uwchradd. Cynllunnir gweithgareddau yn ystod Blynnyddoedd 5 a 6 ynghyd â nosweithiau rhieni i hwyluso'r broses pontio.

Mae'r disgylion yn dilyn cwricwlwm thematig. Trefnir a chynllunnir themâu yn ofalus ar gyfer pob ystod oedran gan sicrhau trosolwg cyfan o'r Cwricwlwm i Gymru.

Gyda chyflwyniad y Cod ADY dros y blynnyddoedd diwethaf, mae blynnyddoedd penodol yn trosglwyddo i'r fformat newydd ar draws amser. Bydd hyn yn hyrwyddo ymagwedd person-ganolig gan gynnwys mewnbwn oddi wrth yr holl asiantaethau addas gyda dilyniant priodol ar gyfer anghenion yr unigolyn. Ffurfir Cynllun Datblygu Unigol ar gyfer y disgylion sydd ag angen, gydag adolygiadau a diweddariadau yn cael eu hystyried yn rheolaidd. Ffurfir grwpiau ymyrraeth yn seiliedig ar ganlyniadau profion a gyflenwir ac asesiadau athro. Dysgir disgylion sydd ag anghenion mewn agweddu penodol mewn grwpiau. Defnyddir strategaethau megis 'ELSA', 'Numicon', grwpiau darllen a Blociau Bendigedig.

Mae cynnydd pob disgyl yn cael ei dracio yn ofalus ac yn rheolaidd gan ddilyn systemau'r ysgol. Parha'r ysgol yr ymdrech i atgyfnerthu deallusrwydd o bwysigrwydd materion amgylcheddol. Mae'r Cyngor Eco/Ysgol yn cwrdd yn rheolaidd ac yn chwilio am ffyrdd y gall arferion sydd yn garedig i'r amgylchedd gael eu hymgorffori i fywyd bob dydd yr ysgol. Rhan holl bwysig o'r ysgol yw llais y plentyn ac maent wedi bod yn casglu syniadau a gweithredu arnynt.

Tynnir sylw at hyrwyddo bwyta'n iach yn gyson gan hyrwyddo bocsys bwyd iach. Bwyteir ffrwyth sydd yn dod o adref yn ystod amser chwarae. Mae bwyta'n iach yn rhan o'r cwricwlwm Iechyd a Lles. Darparwyd brwsys a phast dannedd i'r disgylion priodol gan Cynllun Gwêr a cynhelir sesiwn brwsio dannedd dyddiol yn yr ysgol.

# Addysg yn / Education at Ysgol Gynradd Llanddarog

*Ysgol Gynradd Llanddarog is a Welsh medium, Church of Wales Primary school. Children are immersed in the Welsh language on entry into the Nursery. The main language of instruction throughout the whole school is Welsh. However, English is taught in lessons from Year 3 onwards and an emphasis on bilingualism ensures that pupils achieve high standards in both languages by the end of Year 6. The Headteacher and Staff meet with prospective parents prior to their children starting and explains the advantages of bilingualism. All teaching staff in parents' meetings etc reiterates this message.*

*Parents are helped and supported by teachers in helping their children with homework tasks. Every class within the school are given homework. Homework is given out on a termly basis across the year and is based on termly themes. The aim of the homework is to reinforce the skills learned in school.*

*Most pupils in Ysgol Gynradd Llanddarog attend Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Maes y Gwendraeth for their secondary education. Joint activities are arranged throughout Year 5 and 6 and parents evenings held so that transition is as smooth as possible.*

*The pupils follow a thematic curriculum. Themes are arranged and planned carefully for each age range ensuring complete curriculum coverage.*

*With the ALN code having been introduced over the last few years, specific year groups are being transitioned to the new format. This will allow for a person-centred approach to be implemented with input to all relevant parties at a proportionate rate to the needs of the individual. Individual Development Plans will be created for the pupils that have a need, with reviews and amendments being considered regularly. Intervention groups are formed based on the results of tests administered and Teacher Assessments. Pupils who need extra support in specific areas are taught in groups. Intervention strategies such as 'ELSA', 'Numicon', reading groups and 'Lego Therapy' are used.*

*Progress, of all learners is regularly and carefully tracked. The school continues its effort in reinforcing the importance of environmental issues. School and Eco council meet regularly and look for ways in which environmentally friendly practices can become a part of the school life. Pupil's voice is important, and they have been collecting information and acting on their ideas.*

*The school brings attention to healthy eating regularly and encourages a healthy lunchbox. Pupils can enjoy fruit brought from home during breaktimes. Healthy eating forms a part of the Health and Wellbeing Curriculum. Pupils receive a toothbrush and paste from the Designed to Smile team and toothbrushing sessions are held once a day in school.*

<b>Parhau i ddatblygu profiadau rhifedd cyson ar draws y Cwricwlwm i'r un lefel her a welir yn y llyfrau Mathemateg.</b>	Mae'r staff yn cyd-cynllunio llawer o dasgau rhifedd buddiol a phwrpasol ar draws cwricwlwm yr ysgol. O ganlyniad, mae llawer yn cwbllau tasgau gwerthfawr er mwyn cymhwysyo eu sgiliau rhifedd yn drawsgwricwlaidd. Mae'r staff yn defnyddio'r system tracio yn bwrpasol er mwyn sicrhau bod tasgau yn herio disgyblion, a bod tasgau wedi cynllunio yn ôl gofynion y fframwaith rhifedd. Mae staff yn cynllunio tasgau rhifedd addas sy'n defnyddio'r sgiliau mae'r disgyblion eisoes yn gwybod, a mae'r rhan fwyaf o ddisgyblion yn ymateb yn bositif iddynt. Er hyn, ond ychydig o gyfleoedd sydd i ddisgyblion symud eu dysgu ymlaen. Trwy ddefnyddio system tracio newydd, mae'r staff yn gwahaniaethu llawer o dasgau rhifedd yn ôl gallu'r disgyblion. Mae llawer yn datrys problemau geiriol yn effeithiol, er hynny mae sgiliau darllen y disgyblion yn parhau i rwystro'r cyfleoedd yma. Mae'r rhan fwyaf o ddisgyblion yn cryfhau eu sgiliau mathemategol o fewn tasgau ar draws y cwricwlwm.
<b>Sicrhau bod pob pwrpas ysgrifennu yn cael ei gyflawni dros amser a bod lefel yr her yn sicrhau bod disgyblion yn cyflawni i'w llawn potensial.</b>	Mae gan llawer o ddisgyblion sgiliau cadarn ysgrifennu ar draws y dosbarthiadau, gyda chynnydd briodol yn amlwg a dengys mwy o annibyniaeth wrth i ddisgyblion symud trwy'r ysgol. Mae cyfleoedd chwarae iaith gynnar ac adrodd straeon llafar yn gysylltiedig effeithiol gydag ysgrifennu cynnar yn y dysgu sylfaen. Gwelir gynnydd datblygiadol clir o wneud marciau cynnar i ysgrifennu estynedig annibynnol ar draws yr ysgol. Mae llawer o ddisgyblion yn ysgrifennu'n rheolaidd ac yn bwrpasol mewn ymateb i lenyddiaeth, gan gefnogi dealltwriaeth o ffurf a strwythur. Mae ystod briodol o ddibenion yn amlwg, ond gellir datblygu ysgrifennu creadigol ac estynedig ymhellach mewn rhai grwpiau blwyddyn. Gwelir enghreiffiau addas a phriodol o gyfleoedd i ddefnyddio TGCh wrth ysgrifennu ar draws y cwricwlwm. Gwelir rhai enghreiffiau da a chryf o adborth ystyrlon gan staff. Er hyn, mae angen cryfhau ar draws dosbarthiadau. O ganlyniad, mae angen datblygu cyfleoedd effeithiol i ddisgyblion ymateb yn bwrpasol i'w gwaith ysgrifenedig estynedig.
<b>Codi safonau darllen a systemau ffoneg i gryfhau sgiliau darllen a sillafu pob plentyn yn yr ysgol.</b>	Mae'r rhan fwyaf o ddysgwyr yn gweithio ar neu tuag at ddisgwyliadau sy'n gysylltiedig ag oedran wrth ddarllen. Er bod dealltwriaeth o gynnwys ffeithiol yn gyffredinol gadarn, mae angen cryfhau dealltwriaeth gasgliadol a thrafodaeth werthusol ar gyfer y dysgwyr ieuengaf. Mae'r rhan fwyaf o ddisgyblion yn llwyddo i nodi ffeithiau allweddol o'r hyn maent wedi darllen e.e. dyddiad geni, uchafbwyntiau. Mae'r dysgwyr galluog a thalentog yn dod i gasgliad yn effeithiol. Ond, mae angen cymorth ar leiafrif o ddysgwyr i gasglu tân a chymhelliant. Mae gan lawer o ddisgyblion ddealltwriaeth gadarn o dermau allweddol wrth ddarllen e.e. pencampwr, amrywiaeth. Mae llawer o ddisgyblion yn gallu crynhoi yr hyn maent wedi dysgu yn gryf. Ond disgyblion henaf yr ysgol oedd yn gallu rhoi barn am eu hymatebion. Mae'r llawer o ddisgyblion ieuengaf yr ysgol yn defnyddio'r rhaglen tric a chlic yn effeithiol. Mae'r rhaglen yn datblygu eu sgiliau blendio a segmentio yn gadarn. Mae'r staff yn cynllunio sesiwn gylchedro darllen dyddiol addas er mwyn cryfhau amrywiaeth o sgiliau darllen. Erbyn nawr, mae'r cynllun yn cael effaith gadarnhaol ar sgiliau llawer o ddisgyblion, trwy gynnig cyfleoedd iddynt gymhwysyo sgiliau darllen ar draws y cwricwlwm.
<b>Mireinio Cwricwlwm yr Ysgol gyda ffocws ar sefydlu systemau asesu a thracio effeithiol.</b>	Mae staff yr ysgol wedi arbrofi gyda chwricwlwm cychwynnol yr ysgol yn ei flwyddyn gyntaf, sy'n adlewyrchu anghenion yr ysgol, y gymuned leol, yr eglwys a'r gymuned ehangach. O ganlyniad, mae'r mwyafrif o ddisgyblion yn mwynhau themâu'r ysgol ac yn deall eu pwrpas tuag at ddysgu gydol oes. Mae'r athrawon yn cynllunio llu o brofiadau ar draws y meysydd dysgu a phrofiad, trwy hyrwyddo datblygiad medrau ar draws y cwricwlwm. Wrth graffu ar brofiadau, derbynir y rhan fwyaf o ddisgyblion brofiadau pwrpasol ac addas ar draws pob maes dysgu a phrofiad. Er hyn, ond ychydig o brofiadau RVE, RSE ac Hanes (Dyniaethau) ydy'r plant yn astudio ar draws flwyddyn gyntaf cwricwlwm newydd yr ysgol. Mae cwricwlwm yr ysgol yn nodi'n effeithiol sut y mae'n hybu'r pedwar diben ac yn adlewyrchu'r dau ddeg saith gosodiad o'r hyn sy'n bwysig. Mae'r staff yn defnyddio systemau tracio medrau llythrennedd, rhifedd a chymhwysedd digidol ar draws y cwricwlwm yn bwrpasol ac o ganlyniad yn sicrhau profiadau addas i lawer o ddisgyblion. Er hyn, mae angen parhau i sicrhau bod tasgau wedi cynllunio i annog pob plentyn i gyrraedd eu llawn botensial. Mae systemau hunan asesu ac asesu cyfoedion newydd ar waith ar lawr y dosbarth, wedi gwahaniaethu yn ôl gallu ac oedran, gyda mwy nag hanner y disgyblion yn ymateb iddynt yn bwrpasol. Mae'r ysgol wedi mireinio polisi adborth, marcio, asesu ac arsylwi pwrpasol a maent ar waith ar draws yr ysgol. Mae'r polisi ar waith o fewn llyfrau'r disgyblion, gyda enghreiffiau addas o herio'r disgyblion a symud eu dysgu ymlaen. Er hyn, mae angen sicrhau cysondeb ar draws dosbarthiadau.
<b>I wella proffil presenoldeb yr ysgol, gan gynnwys disgyblion PYDd ac ADY.</b>	Presenoldeb yr ysgol hyd at 17/7/25 ydy 93.41% - sef 0.29% yn is na'r flwyddyn academaidd 23/24, ac yn 1.59% yn is na chanran gofynnol y sir. Ond, canran absenoldebau anawdurdodedig yr ysgol ydy 0.32% - sef 0.42% yn llai na'r flwyddyn academaidd 23/24. Presenoldeb disgyblion gydag ADY ydy 87.53%, sy'n 4.12% yn is na'r flwyddyn academaidd 23/24. Er hyn, presenoldeb disgyblion PYDd ydy 91.07%, sef 5.09% yn fwy na'r flwyddyn academaidd 23/24. Mae gan bron bob un disgybl (93%) presenoldeb sy'n uwch nag 85%, gyda bach yn ia na hanner y disgyblion gyda phresenoldeb dros 95% (47%). # Reviewing the School's Priorities

<p><b>Continue to develop consistent numeracy experiences across the Curriculum to the same level of challenge as seen in the Mathematics books.</b></p>	<p>The staff co-plan many beneficial and purposeful numeracy tasks across the school curriculum. As a result, many pupils complete valuable tasks in order to apply their numeracy skills in a cross-curricular way. Staff use the tracking system purposefully to ensure that tasks challenge pupils, and that tasks are planned in line with the requirements of the numeracy framework. Staff plan suitable numeracy tasks that use the skills pupils already know, and most pupils respond positively to them. However, there are only a few opportunities for pupils to move their learning forward. By using the new tracking system, staff differentiate many numeracy tasks according to pupils' ability. Many solve word problems effectively, however pupils' reading skills continue to hinder these opportunities. Most pupils strengthen their mathematical skills within tasks across the curriculum.</p>
<p><b>Ensure that every writing purpose is achieved over time and that the level of challenge ensures pupils achieve their full potential.</b></p>	<p>Many pupils have secure writing skills across the classes, with appropriate progress evident and showing greater independence as pupils move through the school. Early language play opportunities and oral storytelling are effectively linked with early writing in the foundation learning. Clear developmental progress is seen from early mark-making to independent extended writing across the school. Many pupils write regularly and purposefully in response to literature, supporting their understanding of form and structure. An appropriate range of purposes is evident, but creative and extended writing could be developed further in some year groups. Suitable and appropriate examples of opportunities to use ICT in writing across the curriculum are seen. There are some good and strong examples of meaningful feedback from staff. However, this needs to be strengthened across classes. As a result, there is a need to develop effective opportunities for pupils to respond purposefully to their extended written work.</p>
<p><b>Raise reading standards and phonics systems to strengthen the reading and spelling skills of every child in the school.</b></p>	<p>Most learners are working at or towards age-related expectations in reading. Although understanding of factual content is generally secure, there is a need to strengthen inferential understanding and evaluative discussion for the youngest learners. Most pupils succeed in identifying key facts from what they have read, e.g. date of birth, highlights. More able and talented learners draw conclusions effectively. However, a minority of learners need support to grasp tone and motivation. Many pupils have a secure understanding of key terms when reading, e.g. champion, variety. Many pupils are able to summarise what they have learned effectively. However, it was the oldest pupils in the school who were able to give opinions about their responses. Many of the youngest pupils in the school use the Tric a Chlic programme effectively. The programme develops their blending and segmenting skills securely. Staff plan appropriate daily guided reading sessions in order to strengthen a variety of reading skills. By now, the scheme is having a positive impact on the skills of many pupils, by offering them opportunities to apply reading skills across the curriculum.</p>
<p><b>Refine the School Curriculum with a focus on establishing effective assessment and tracking systems.</b></p>	<p>The school staff experimented with the school's initial curriculum in its first year, reflecting the needs of the school, the local community, the church, and the wider community. As a result, the majority of pupils enjoy the school's themes and understand their purpose towards lifelong learning. Teachers plan a wide range of experiences across the areas of learning and experience, promoting skill development across the curriculum. When reviewing experiences, most pupils engage in purposeful and appropriate experiences across all areas of learning and experience. However, there are few experiences in RVE, RSE, and History (Humanities) studied by pupils during the first year of the school's new curriculum. The school curriculum effectively identifies how it promotes the four purposes and reflects the twenty-seven statements of what matters. Staff use literacy, numeracy, and digital competence tracking systems across the curriculum purposefully and, as a result, provide appropriate experiences for many pupils. However, it remains necessary to ensure that tasks are planned to encourage every child to reach their full potential. New self-assessment and peer-assessment systems are in place in classrooms, differentiated according to ability and age, with more than half of pupils responding purposefully to them. The school has refined its policy for feedback, marking, assessment, and purposeful observation, and these are implemented across the school. The policy is evident in pupils' books, with suitable examples of challenging pupils and moving their learning forward. However, there is a need to ensure consistency across classes</p>
<p><b>To improve the school's attendance profile, including ALN (Additional Learning Needs) and FSM (Free School Meals) pupils.</b></p>	<p>The school's attendance up to 17/7/25 is 93.41% – which is 0.29% lower than the 2023/24 academic year, and 1.59% below the county's required percentage. However, the school's rate of unauthorized absences is 0.32% – 0.42% lower than in the 2023/24 academic year. Attendance for pupils with ALN is 87.53%, which is 4.12% lower than in 2023/24. However, attendance for FSM pupils is 91.07%, which is 5.09% higher than in 2023/24.</p> <p>Almost all pupils (93%) have attendance higher than 85%, with just under half of pupils having attendance over 95% (47%). Only a very small number of pupils (7%) have attendance below 85%. As a result, the school will continue to implement attendance improvement measures and monitor outcomes term by term in the 2025/2026 academic year.</p>

Yn ogystal, mae yna dŷ bach ar gyfer staff. Yn neuadd ginio'r ysgol (block 5) darparir 2 dŷ bach ar gyfer holl ddisgyblion yr ysgol. Yn gegin yr ysgol (block 5) darparir tŷ bach ar gyfer staff arlwno. Mae gan bob tŷ bach dŵr poeth, dŵr oer, papur toiled, sebon a phapur sychu/sychwr dwylo. Mae'r toiledau yn cael eu glanhau gan staff a ddarperir gan yr Awdurdod Lleol.

## *Provision of toilet facilities*

*The toilets for pupils in Nursery to Year 2 are within the cabin (block 8). There is 1 toilet for the girls, 1 toilet for the boys and 1 toilet for disabled/staff. The toilets for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are on the ground floor in the main building (block 1). There are 2 toilets and a urinal for the boys and 2 toilets for the girls. In addition, there is a toilet for staff. Within the school canteen (block 5), there are 2 toilets for all pupils within the school. Within the school kitchen (block 5), a toilet is provided for the catering staff. All toilets have cold water, hot water, toilet paper, soap and paper towels/dryer to dry hands. The toilets are cleaned by cleaning staff employed by the Local Authority.*
