- Staff will be on duty in both yards from 8.55am until the bell rings at 9.05am. For KS2 pupils there is no need to walk up the yard with them as they will be closely supervised by staff.





Important things to note:

- Crop tops are unacceptable for PE clothing
- <u>Jewellery</u> is not allowed to be worn at school. For health & safety reasons
 only stud earrings are suitable These **must** be removed or covered during PE lessons.
- Nail varnish and make up are not suitable for school.
- No mobile phones are allowed to be brought to school. If these are necessary for after school activities, they must be handed in to the school office on arrival at school for safe keeping.





School Dinners



- There is a hot main meal choice including a vegetarian option available daily plus a selection of vegetables, seasonal salads, a pasta option and wholemeal bread. There is also a daily main pudding with an additional option of fruit bowl choice. A daily selection of chilled milk or water are available.





- **Google Classroom:** In September, your child's class teacher will upload information such as PE days, homework, timetables etc onto the google classroom. Teachers will help your child join the classroom in school.
