

The first thing you will notice is that Gowerton school will be a lot bigger than your primary.


Do not be afraid, it is very easy to find your way around. All blocks and classrooms are very clearly labelled, and everybody is very helpful so don't worry about getting lost!

TOP COAT: School hooded top and bearing the school badge (optional) any other plain coat provided there is no slogan on it








Food - Bwyd

Gowerton is a 'Cashless Catering' School and therefore cash is not accepted at the canteen tills. You will need about an average of £3 per day to put into the machine to be able to purchase lunch.

You won't be allowed to leave the school site at break and lunch times, therefore you are encouraged to eat food provided from our canteen or to bring your own packed lunch.

A variety of food is provided at both break time, 10.30am - 10.50am, and at lunch time, 1.10pm - 2pm.



Well-being - Lles

Our well-being centre 'Gofal', located centrally in the school was purpose built to deal with all issues for both pastoral and health. It is here that the child welfare manager and pastoral support workers are based and are always there to support you at any given time.

Mrs King is Head of Year 7, but there will be times where other members of staff can help you.

We have our own Child Welfare Manager, Mrs Richards on site to deal with any possible health and well-being issue you wish to discuss.




