Another week full of new learning!

This week in our phonics we looked at the other 3 split digraphs e-e, o-e and u-e. This spelling pattern is a tricky one that will need to be reinforced and re-visited throughout the years, but we all had a good try at using them. Our first spelling test was this Monday and it went really well. Results will be written in Red Homework book each week, and new spellings stuck in, so it is important for them to come into school on a Monday please.



It was also our first week for listening to readers. It was lovely and very useful to see the comments from family members in the Reading Diaries, so thank you. Next week will be the turn of the Blue Group.

In our writing we have looked at when to use capital letters and how to form them. We have also looked at new vocabulary to use in our writing when describing the sea.

In maths we used our number bonds to 10 when adding 3 different numbers together. This was quite challenging but there was great perseverance and determination shown to really understand it. We also went outside to measure in meters, different objects around our school grounds.

In PE this week, we created our own class dance, thinking about different sea



creatures and how they move. Everyone came up with wonderful ideas and contributed well. The other half of the class also got the chance to express themselves in their art work, when we looked at the work of artists who had taken inspiration from the sea. In music half of us listened to a song called 'Ship on the Ocean' and learned to sing it and even

played along with some percussion instruments. This was brilliant fun!

In our topic/geography work, we learned all about the 5 oceans in our world and sang along to a song by Hopscotch that helped us remember them.

Finally we all had a very worthwhile first lesson all about how to stay safe when near roads in our Kerbcraft lesson. These will be carrying on for the next few weeks every Wednesday afternoon and will hopefully help keep us all safe now and in the future.
