

Hello Everyone,

This week in our literacy we have looked at the phonic sound ph (sounds like f) as in phone and graph and also words that end in -op -ing -it or -ip, which link to our spellings for Monday coming. We have also learned about onomatopoeic words! What are they I hear you ask?! They are words that sound like the noise they describe. E.G. crackle, splash, oink. We used these words to write captions to go with pictures from a story called, 'Toby and the Fire of London.' The results were amazing and I could not have been more proud of the hardwork of everyone. At the end of the week we tried writing questions to ask in our upcoming 'Hot-seating' session. We had to think of questions we might ask people from 1666 about their experiences of the Fire of London. In Welsh, we practiced our oracy skills, saying what clothes we were wearing. Mrs Bowen filmed us on SeeSaw.



In our Numeracy lessons, we looked at doubling and used this skill to solve problems later on in the week. We have also carried on looking at analogue time, focussing on revising o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.



In our 'Move It Monday' PE session, we carried on with our gymnastics, learning 3 more holds. We then worked in pairs to create a mirror routine made up of the 9 holds we have learned so far.



In our Outdoor Session, we combined our analogue time knowledge with the great outdoors and had to match clock faces to their corresponding words.

In our Topic work we carried on learning about electrical appliances and went on a hunt around school, drawing things that use electricity.

In art, we used pastels to create a fiery picture and then cut out a frame in the form of a tunnel to stick on top. We will be adding a picture of ourself to this, to represent us looking at the Fire of London back in the past!
