This week in our literacy we have looked at the phonic sound 'ea' as in head and bread and also words that end in -ob -ut or -up, which link to our spellings for Monday after half term. We also got to use the questions we thought of last week, to ask people from 1666 about their experiences of the Fire of London, in our first HotSeating experience. WOW!!!!!! In our Numeracy lessons, we looked at halving and we have also carried on looking at analogue time, focussing on revising o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to, and for those confident enough, we tried telling the time in 5 minute intervals on both the past and to side. In our 'Move It Monday' PE session, we carried on with our gymnastics, and using the holds and different ways of travelling, working in groups of 10 to create a group routine. The co-ordination and effort of all was fantastic, with everyone performing with skill and confidence.

In our Outdoor Session, we revised our analogue time knowledge with the great outdoors and had to match clock faces to their corresponding words. We were much improved this week!



In our Topic work we carried on learning about electricity, but looked at electrical dangers around the house, creating safety rules for at home and in school. In our history work we looked at different diary extracts from people who lived in 1666 and had to match the diary extract to who we thought wrote it.
