This week in our literacy we have looked at the phonic sound 'oi' as in coin and soil and also words that end in -um or -am, which link to our spellings for Monday coming. We used our Recount Writing skills to create our own Fire of London diary account, adding the features we had agreed on as our Success Criteria. We also wrote new words to accompany the song, London's Burning. I have to say, they are an actual improvement on the original!

In Welsh the children read some short passages about 3 characters from 1666, and then had to show their understanding of the texts by answering questions about them.



In our Numeracy lessons, we looked at understanding compass directions and got rather wet in Coed Cadno finding Fire of London objects hidden in the trees! We also used these new skills to read and answer questions about the locations of objects on a school map later in the week. We were awesome at this!

In our 'Move It Monday' PE session, we finished creating our Fire of London dance and performed it to each other. The boys won the title of Best Dancers. Eat your heart out Wayne Sleep! (Showing my age here! Most of you will never have heard of him. Ask your parents!)

In our Topic work we carried on discussing Christianity and Judaism and sorted various artefacts from Christian and Jewish faiths.

In science we carried on investigating electrical circuits and predicted then tested which materials are conductors or insulators, allowing the electrical charge to flow through them, to complete a circuit and light a light bulb.



Finally, we had great fun in art following an on-line tutorial on how to draw a dragon, which we did using felt-tip pens. The results were out of this world!
