RE topics for this term:

<u>Galilee to Jerusalem:</u> - In this topic we will be developing our understanding of:

- The story of The Presentation of the Lord
- How people celebrate Candlemas
- How Jesus is a 'light' for all people, and consider how they can bring 'light' to their families and communities.
- Zacchaeus' story

<u>Desert to garden</u>- In this topic we will be developing our understanding of:

- The events of the last week of Jesus' life (The Last Supper and The Crucifixion and death of Jesus)
- How Jesus died and rose again

Weekly Reminders

Activities will be sent home which link directly to what the children are learning in school and supports their work in class. Please make every effort to support them and to complete the tasks set.







The Power of Water

How is water powerful?

- We will learn about the properties of materials.
- We will predict and investigate suitable materials.
- We will learn that water keeps our bodies healthy.
- We will design a label to promote drinking water.
