Catholic Virtues

This term we will be trying to be ***Curious & Active, Intentional & Prophetic*** and learners.

RE topics for this term:

Galilee to Jerusalem – By the end of this topic, pupils will have learnt about:

- How the Beatitudes tell us about how to live a good life.
- The links between the Beatitudes and the Ten Commandments.
- The Sermon on the Mount.
- The greatest commandment and they will have thought about how they could live it out.
- How the Our Father is the perfect prayer given to us by Jesus himself.

Desert to Garden - By the end of this topic, pupils will have learnt about:

- Explain what happens at the Ash Wednesday Mass.
- Make links between the Ash Wednesday readings and Lent, as a time when Christians reflect on their sins and listen to God's call to return to him.
- Know that the Rosary is a prayerful reflection on the life of Christ and explain what the sorrowful mysteries remember.
- Think about the temptations that Jesus faced in the wilderness, asking 'what if' questions about the times that they have faced temptations in their own lives.



Through investigating the contemporary and historical contexts, and by exploring the human experience in their own localities and elsewhere in Wales, learners can start to discover their heritage and develop a sense of place and cynefin.

As pupils explore their locality and Wales, as well as the wider world, learners can establish a solid base of knowledge and understanding of geographical and historical concepts. This exploration will encourage learners to use different methods of enquiry, evaluate the evidence that they find, and apply and communicate their findings effectively. These experiences, in and outside the classroom, will help them become ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives.
