

Whilst we all want to enjoy the evening, school cannot be responsible for any extra costs associated with this event and encourage all families to keep this in mind when making choices. The cost of the tickets will be £26.

The pupils will be invited to meet at the front of the school for photographs with friends, family and staff between 5:15 - 6:00pm. They will then travel by coach to the Glynclydach Hotel for a lovely evening of dancing, raffles, a buffet and good fun! The pupils can be collected from the rear school car park on their return journey at 11:15pm. Please can we thank parents in advance for **not** attending the venue due to the logistical and safety issues this presents.

It is important to note that attendance at the event is one of the privileges of being part of our school community. It is dependent on having a positive approach to school life, and embracing our community, reflected by a positive number of PERx.
