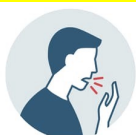

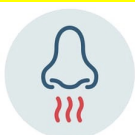
How to let us know if you have a positive Covid-19 case



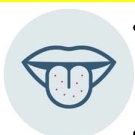
