Year 2: 'Seasides' Topic Homework Ideas

Please find below suggested activities for project homework linked to our 'Seasides (past and present)' topic. Children are asked to complete at least 6 of the activities by the end of the summer term. Complete homework should be brought into school **or** a photo can be posted onto our class blog so that it can be celebrated.

Draw/paint a picture of a seaside landscape. Label any features you know.



Make a model of a seaside artefact or feature. For example: shells, buckets, boats or a crab.



Make a poster about animals who might live by or in the sea.





In the past people watched Punch and Judy shows as entertainment at the seaside. Draw/label or make your own Punch and Judy show.



Design a beach hut for Brighton in the 1900s.



We are looking at how the seaside was different 100 years ago. Research and write about 3 things that were different.



Design your own bathing costume for a boy or girl that would have lived in the 1900s.





We are learning about islands. Make a poster or leaflet explaining why people should visit an island of your choice. (Jamaica, Cyprus, Sri Lanka).

There are many attractions at the seaside to entertain us. Design and label your own entertainment attraction for a beach in 2022.



Write a short seaside adventure story. It could be about pirates, killer whales, mermaids, holidays, swimming or anything to do with the sea or seaside.

Make your own poster about keeping safe by the seaside. Some ideas could include keeping safe in the sun and a list of things you should bring along with you.
