I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the governing body to thank you for your continued support during the year and I have been pleased to see so many of you attending the many events throughout the year including parents evenings, our musical production of Annie, the Christmas and St David's Day services at the cathedral and our inaugural school sports to name a few.

I very much look forward to the school's first set of GCSE results in August and the introduction of new key performance measures at key stage 4 along with a series of new qualifications has certainly kept everyone at the school very busy. You will know that the school has prepared very well for these developments and we hope to build upon what were excellent outcomes in 2018, which were amongst the best in Wales.

Increasingly, Ysgol Penrhyn Dewi is becoming the 'school of choice' for many families within the area and further afield. The school is looking forward to welcoming a number of new pupils at the start of the new academic year which will result in our on role numbers growing from 463 pupils in September 2018 to 555 pupils in September 2019.

Since the opening of the school, we have continued with our programme of maintenance of the three campuses. Whilst some of our buildings are older, we work hard to invest in the internal and external appearance and the facilities on offer to pupils and staff. The installation of internal doors, painting at Non over the summer holiday and further investment into IT across the school helps generate a learning culture fit for the twenty-first century.

Finally, I offer my thanks to everyone associated with the school. I pay tribute to the staff and parents, the governing body and all the helpers and volunteers for their support. However, I pay special tribute to our wonderful pupils. We have started to develop a caring inclusive school community based on Christian values and it is an immense privilege to be part of it. The partnership with the Cathedral also continues to grow.

We look forward to working together next year to ensure Ysgol Penrhyn Dewi continues to grow and flourish.

About the Governing Body

There are 20 governors in total with a wide variety of experience. Governors work closely with the Headteacher and the school. We formulate the aims and policies of the school. No individual governor has any over-arching authority; sub-committees have



delegated powers awarded by the governing body as a whole. The Chair, however, has the authority to answer letters, deal with emergencies and liaise with the Headteacher without constant recourse to the full governing body.

Our school is a Church in Wales 3 - 16 Voluntary Aided School. This means religious education and worship are led through the Christian faith and we are able to apply specific requirements for pupil entry and staff appointments.

The Church In Wales is our founding body and appoints the majority of governors, known as foundation governors. The governing body is a vital part of the school's leadership and our role in developing the work of the school as a church school is independently inspected. The Headteacher, staff and governors work as a united team dedicated to raising standards and values for all pupils.

The full governing body met three times this academic year.

The school continues to work closely together as a community of parents, governors and staff. We aim to build closer links with the Cathedral, other parishes and the cluster schools within our peninsula developing high quality cross-phase projects in many areas of the formal and informal curriculum.

INDIVIDUAL GOVERNORS' SUB-COMMITTEES

The governing body operates a system of sub-committees, reporting each term to the full governing body. Each sub-committee manages, supports and oversees different areas of school life. To be effective, regular visits to the school take place, with opportunities to share training events and to link closely with different members of staff and their areas of responsibility.



Challenge and Support Committee

Chair: Mr Darren Thomas

The Challenge and Support Committee met five times throughout the year. This committee looks at the standards, performance and teaching remit. All governors are invited to attend.

The committee reviews:

- How Well the school is doing?
- How do we as governors know?
- What needs to change?

In order to answer these questions, the committee monitors and evaluates achievement and progress throughout the school in relation to school-based, local, family of schools and national performance data, as well as the impact of learning and teaching on standards and pupil progress. The committee evaluates the findings of internal reviews and monitoring/feedback and supports the leadership team in reviewing provision to support sustained school improvement.

Finance, Curriculum and Staffing

Chair: Mr Richard Thornton

The Finance, Curriculum and Staffing committee met five times throughout the year. The committee establishes priorities for expenditure and ensures that these support school management and development plans. It considers in detail the distribution of the budget in relation to the school improvement plan and maintains a strategic financial plan for the school that meets the LA guidelines. The committee scrutinises regular reports on the budget and financial processes and investigates variances from the agreed spending plan. The committee monitors the school's financial and budgetary processes and ensures that financial regulations are complied with at all times. It checks that school accounts are maintained accurately to facilitate external audits and monitors auditors recommendations. The committee continues to work closely with the other committees to help enhance the structure, resources and facilities of the school whilst adhering at all times to the strict budget provided to us. The Headteacher and school business manager report to this committee on a half-termly basis.

Community, Premises, Health and Safety

The Community, Premises, Health and Safety met four times throughout the year. The committee provides support to the Headteacher on all matters related to the school premises and grounds, security and health and safety. It prepare, refurbishment and development and ensures that the school obtains 'best value' in the services provided. Admissions Committee

The Admissions committee met twelve times throughout the year. The committee consider all applications received from Pembrokeshire County Council online admissions website, following the admissions policy adopted by the full governing body.

The committee met twice throughout the year and will be meeting on a termly basis from September. This committee was established to support the distinctive nature of our school. It provides strategic direction for the maintenance and development of the Christian Ethos and Vison of the school as well as developing the spiritual life of the school through curriculum provision indiscreetly in religious education as a subject and discreetly in cross-curricular approaches. The committee monitors and evaluates progress towards the achievement of these aims. Membership of this committee includes governors, school and cathedral staff and representative pupils from across the school.

The table and graph show a trend in the performance of our Year 11 students over time. The L1 (Level One) Threshold shows the percentage of our students who gained 5 GCSEs between A* and G, or equivalent qualifications. The Level Two Threshold (L2) works the same way, but between the grades of A* to C. The measure, often referred to as "L2 Threshold including", reflects the percentage of students who gained 5 GCSE grades at A* to C, or equivalent qualifications, that included both an English and Mathematics pass at Grade C or better. The dotted lines below shows the trend, or direction of achievement over time whilst the solid lines show actual performance.

Key Stage 4 Family of Schools Overview



In 2009, the Welsh Government collated all school data to produce a document for each school called the 'All Wales Core Data Set'. To allow for school improvement, schools were grouped into 'Families' so that comparisons could be made and, through collaborative endeavours, best practices could be shared. Our 'Family' includes 10 other schools who are deemed to have similar contexts to ours, determined through a calculation based on the percentage of Free School Meals in the school, the percentage of students on the Special Educational Needs Register and the percentage of students who live in areas that are the most deprived in Wales. In 2018, we are seen as the 12th least challenged of our Family and, as such, should have been amongst the highest performers, <u>if not indeed the best</u>. The table below shows our school's performance (as a percentage), compared to our family performance in 2018.
