Mrs Morris monitors attendance closely and will work with families to support children who may be struggling. Please check SeeSaw for information related to Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA). If your child's attendance dips below a certain level, you may receive a letter to ask for medical evidence for any future absences or to request a meeting with the Headteacher to discuss a plan to make improvements over time. The Education Welfare Officer may also become involved and in some cases, fixed penalty notices may be issued by the Local Authority for persistent non-attendance.

Our attendance as of 20th December currently stands at <u>**94.9**%.</u> This is fantastic!

We are also so pleased that so many children have achieved their "Strive for 95%" attendance awards this term. These will be presented to them in assembly on the last day of term.

Thank you to everyone for your hard work in ensuring that the children attend school regularly. This has a positive impact on their progress in learning.
